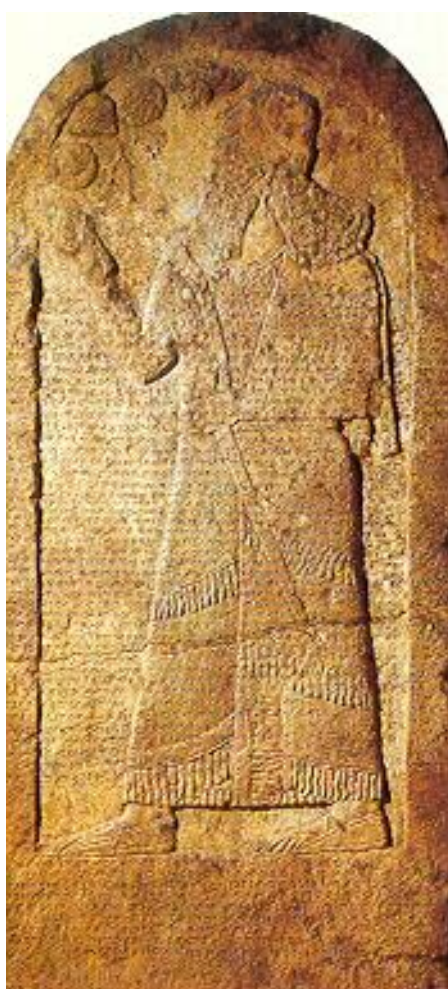

1 Kings 6:1 477 years after the Exodus marked the beginning of Solomon's reign – $2448 + 477 = \text{year } 2925$.

In the four hundred and eightieth year after the children of Israel came out of the land of Egypt, in the fourth year of Solomon's reign over Israel, in the month Ziv, which is the second month, he began to build the House of the LORD.

3042 + 853 = 3895 years to our era, so the "fall of man" was 3895 + 2025 = 5920 years ago.		



This statue is evidence of the Battle of Qarqar in 853 BC.

The inscription "describes the military campaigns of his (Shalmaneser III's) reign until 853 B.C.E." The stela of Ashurnasirpal II is made of limestone with a rounded top. It is 193 centimeters (6.5 ft) high, 93 centimeters (3.6 ft) wide, and 27 centimeters (10.6 ft) deep.

In 853 B.C.E., two major battles took place: the Battle of Qarqar and the Battle of Ramoth-Gilead. At Qarqar, the Assyrians led by King Shalmaneser III fought against a coalition of eleven kings, including King Hadadezer (possibly Ben-Hadad II) of Aram-Damascus and King Ahab of Israel. According to the Bible, there was also a battle at Ramoth-Gilead around that time between the armies of Ahab of Israel and the king of Syria, in which Ahab was killed.

- Battle of Qarqar: A battle between the Neo-Assyrian Empire and an allied army of eleven kings.
- Battle of Ramoth-Gilead: A battle between the Israelite King Ahab and the king of Syria, which, according to the Bible, took place in the same year.

Biblical Chronology Regarding the Fall

Year 0 Eve was deceived by Gadreel, incarnated as the serpent. Genesis 3:6 Book of Enoch 12:69.6

Genesis 3:6 KJV When the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband with her, and he ate.

Book of Enoch, chapter 12:69.6 And the name of the third is Gadreel, who is the one who breathed all the deadly breaths into the sons of men. And he deceived Eve. And he showed the weapons of death to the sons of men, the shields and the breastplates, and the sword for the murderer, and all the weapons of death to the sons of men.

Revelation 20:10 “And the devil who deceived them was thrown into the lake of fire and brimstone where the beast and the false prophet are, and they will be tormented day and night forever and ever.”

Note: The word “devil” does not specifically mean Satan, because there are many devils.

Biblical Chronology of the Shem, Ham, and Japheth Passage

Year 1556 Birth of Shem, Ham, and Japheth. Genesis 5:32. Noah 500 years. Triplets, really?

Genesis 5:32 KJV [32] When Noah was five hundred years old, Noah begot Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

Year 1558 Birth of Shem Book of Jasher 5:18

Book of Jasher 5:18 Noah was 502 years old when Naamah gave birth to Shem. The boys grew and walked in the ways of the Lord, in all that Methuselah and their father Noah taught.

Genesis 11:10 [10] These are the generations of Shem. When Shem was a hundred years old, he begot Arphaxad, two years after the flood.

Biblical Chronology and the Flood

Year 1656: Flood, duration 1 year Genesis 7:6 & 8:13.

Book of Jasher 6:14. All the fountains of the great deep were broken up, and the windows of heaven were opened, and rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights. 15. Noah and his household and every living creature that was with him were in the ark because of the waters of the flood, and the Lord shut it behind him. 37. The Lord listened to Noah’s voice and said to him, “At the end of a full year you shall go out.” 38. At the end of the year, when Noah had been in the ark for a full year, the waters dried up from the earth, and Noah removed the covering of the ark.

Genesis 7:6 ‘Noah was six hundred years old when the flood came upon the earth. ‘

Genesis 8:13 ‘Now it came to pass in the six hundred and first year, in the first month, on the first day of the month, that the waters were dried up from the earth. Then Noah removed the covering of the ark and looked out, and behold, the surface of the ground was dry.’

The birth of the triplets (according to the Bible), but according to the “Biblical” chronology

Year 1916: Birth of Haran and Nahor. Book of Jasher 7:22

Year 1948: Birth of Abraham, Terah 70 years. Book of Jasher 7:50

Book of Jasher 7:22. His brother Peleg begot Reu, and Reu begot Serug, and Serug begot Nahor, and Nahor begot Terah. Terah was 38 years old and begot Haran and Nahor.

Book of Jasher 7:50. Terah took a wife, and her name was Amthello, daughter of Cornebo. Terah’s wife conceived and bore him a son in those days. Terah was seventy years old when he fathered him, and Terah named the son who was born to him Abram, because the king had exalted him in those days and distinguished him above all the dignitaries who were with him.

Book of Jasher 24:27. Nahor, son of Terah, brother of Abraham, died in those days in the fortieth year of Isaac’s life. All the days of Nahor were 172 years; he died and was buried in Haran.

Isaac was born in $2048 + 40 = 2088 - 172 = 1916$, the year of Nahor’s birth.

Book of Jasher 12:16. Terah was greatly afraid in the king’s presence, and he said to the king, “It was Haran my oldest son who advised me to do this.” Now Haran was 32 years old in those days when Abram was born. Abraham’s year of birth $1948 - 32 = 1916$ is Haran’s year of birth.

The “biblical” chronology tells of Abraham’s first departure to Canaan.

Year 2003: Abraham’s first departure to Canaan. Book of Jasher 13:1-9

Year 2006: Noah 950 years old and dies at the age of 58. Book of Jasher 13:9 Genesis 9:28

Book of Jasher Chapter 13:1. Terah took his son Abram, his grandson Lot the son of Haran, his daughter-in-law Sarai, his son Abram's wife, and all the people of his household, and went with them from Ur Casdim to go to the land of Canaan. When they arrived in the land of Haran, they stayed there, for it was good pastureland and large enough for those who accompanied him. 2. And the people of the land of Haran saw that Abram was good and righteous before God and man, and that the Lord his God was with him, and some of the people of the land of Haran came and joined themselves to Abram, and he taught them the statutes of the Lord and his ways; and these people dwelt with Abram in his house, and they remained faithful to him. 3. And Abram dwelt in the land three years, and at the end of three years the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, I am the Lord who brought thee out of Ur Casdim, and delivered thee out of the hand of all thine enemies. 4. Now therefore, if thou wilt hearken to my voice, and wilt keep my commandments, my statutes, and my laws, then will I cause thine enemies to fall before thee, and will multiply thy seed as the stars of heaven, and will bless all the works of thy hands, and thou shalt lack nothing. 5. Now arise, take all your wives belonging to you, and go into the land of Canaan, and dwell there; and I will be your God there, and will bless you. And Abram arose, and took all his wives belonging to him, and went into the land of Canaan, as the Lord had said unto him. And Abram was fifty-five years old when he went out from Haran. 6. And Abram came into the land of Canaan, and dwelt in the midst of the city; and there he pitched his tent among the children of Canaan, the inhabitants of the land. 7. And the Lord appeared unto Abram when he came into the land of Canaan, and said unto him, This is the land which I give to you and to your seed for ever; and I will make your seed as the stars of heaven, and I will give unto your seed for an inheritance all the lands which you see. 8. Abram built an altar in the place where God had spoken to him, and there Abram called on the name of the Lord. 9. After Abram had lived in the land of Canaan for three years, that year Noah died, which was in the fifty-eighth year of Abram's life. All the days that Noah lived were 950 years, and he died.

Genesis 9:28-29 "And Noah lived after the flood 350 years. So all the days of Noah were 950 years, and he died."

Book of Jasher Chapter 13:17-28

It was in the 15th year of Abram's sojourn in the land of Canaan, which is the 70th year of Abram's life, that the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am the Lord who brought you out of Ur Casdim to give you this land as an inheritance. 18 Now therefore walk before Me and be blameless and keep My commandments, for to you and your offspring I will give this land as an inheritance, from the River Mizraim to the great River Euphrates." 19. And you shall go to your fathers in peace and in a good old age, and the fourth generation shall return here to this land, and shall inherit this land forever. And Abram built an altar, and called on the name of the Lord who appeared to him, and he offered sacrifices on the altar to the Lord. 20. At that time Abram returned to Haran to see his father and mother and his father's household; and Abram and his wives and all who belonged to him returned to Haran. And Abram dwelt in Haran five years. 21. And many of the people of Haran, about seventy-two men, followed Abram, and he taught them the statutes of the Lord; and he taught them the Lord in all His ways. 22 In those days the Lord appeared to Abram in Haran, and said to him, "See, I spoke to you twenty years ago, saying, 23 'Get out of your country, and from your kindred, and from your father's house, to the land which I showed you to give to you and your children; for there in that land I will bless you and make of you a great nation. I will magnify your name, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed. 24 'Therefore arise, go out of this place, you and your wife, and all who belong to you, and all who were born in your house, and all who had been made in Haran; bring them out from here, that you may return to the land of Canaan.' 25 So Abram arose and took Sarai his wife and all who belonged to him, and all who were born to him in his house, and all who had been made in Haran, and they went out to go to the land of Canaan. 26 And Abram went and returned to the land of Canaan, according to the word of the Lord. And Lot the son of Haran his brother

went with him. And Abram was seventy-five years old when he went out from Haran to return to the land of Canaan. 27 And he came to the land of Canaan, according to the word of the Lord which he had spoken unto Abram; and he pitched his tent, and dwelt in the plains of Mamre. With him were his brother Lot his son, and all that were with him. 28 And the Lord appeared unto Abram the second time, and said, To thy seed will I give this land. And Abram built there an altar unto the Lord, who appeared unto him in the plains of Mamre.

God's Promise, Abraham's 70th Birthday.

Year 2018: Abraham 70 years, God's promise, **430 years before the Exodus**. Genesis 15:14,16 BdO 13:17

Exodus 12:40, 42 NIV Now the time that the Israelites lived in Egypt was four hundred and thirty years. This was a night of observance to the Lord, to bring them out of the land of Egypt. This is the night of observance to the Lord for all the Israelites throughout their generations.

Note: The Exodus was in 2448, exactly 400 years after the birth of Isaac in 2048. The Bible is not always accurate, because the Israelites lived in Egypt for 210 years. The beginning of the tribulation period began with the tribulation of Isaac by Ishmael; Ishmael attempted to kill Isaac. God made the promise to Abraham 430 years before the Exodus.

Book of Jasher Chapter 81:1. The children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about 600,000 foot soldiers, besides children and their wives. 2. A large mixed people also went up with them, with flocks and herds, and much cattle. 3. The children of Israel, who dwelt in the land of Egypt with hard labor, lasted 210 years (their sojourning from the time of the covenant sacrifice was 430 years). 4. At the end of 210 years the Lord brought the children of Israel out of Egypt with a mighty hand (400 years after the birth of Isaac, Abraham's descendants). 5. The children of Israel journeyed out of Egypt, Goshen, and Rameses, and encamped in Succoth on the 15th day of the first month (the month of the Passover). 6 And the Egyptians buried all their firstborn whom the Lord had smitten: and all the Egyptians buried their slain three days. 7 And the children of Israel journeyed from Succoth, and encamped in Etham, in the edge of the wilderness.

God's promise when Abraham was 70 years old, 430 years before the Exodus

Testament of Levi, paragraphs 11 and 12

11. Levi's Children: So I took Melchah as my wife when I was twenty-eight years old. She named our firstborn son Gershon, because we were staying in our land. Gershon means "staying." But I saw that he was not to inherit the blessing of the firstborn. Kohath was born in my thirty-fifth year, in the east. Later, in a vision, I saw him towering above all the congregation; hence, I named him Kohath, which means, beginning of majesty and instruction. Third, she gave birth to Merari, in the fortieth year of my life; and because his mother bore him with difficulty, she named him Merari, which means "my bitterness," because he too died. Jochebed was born in my sixty-fourth year — **so Levi was 63 years old** — in Egypt, for I was then renowned among my broth

12. Levi's Grandchildren: Gershon took a wife, and she bore Lomni and Shemei. The sons of Kohath were Amram, Izhar, Hebron, and Uzziel. The sons of Merari were Mahli and Mushi. In my ninety-fourth year, Amram took my daughter Jochebed to be his wife, for they were both born on the same day. I was eight years old when I entered the land of Canaan, and eighteen years old when I killed Shechem. In my nineteenth year, I became a priest, and in my twenty-eighth year, I took a wife. Fourteen years later, I entered Egypt. See, you are my children and grandchildren. In my one hundred and eighteenth year, Joseph died.

The Birth of Moses According to "Biblical Chronology"

Year 2364: Birth of Miriam Book of Jasher 67:2

Year 2365: Birth of Aaron Book of Jasher 67:4

Year 2368: Birth of Moses, Jochebed 130 Years Book of Jasher 67:1-4

Book of Jasher, Chapter 67 67:1. There was a man in the land of Egypt of the descendants of Levi, named Amram, son of Kohath, son of Levi, son of Israel. 2. This man went and took a wife, Jochebed, daughter of Levi and his father's sister. She was 126 years old, and he went in to her. 3. The woman conceived and bore a daughter, and she named her Miriam, because in those days the Egyptians had embittered the lives of the children of Israel. 4. And she conceived again and bore a son, and she named him Aaron, because in the days of her conception Pharaoh began to shed the blood of the males of Israel.

Book of Jasher, Chapter 67:11. In the 130th year after Israel's departure to Egypt, Pharaoh dreamed that he was sitting on his royal throne. He looked up and saw an old man standing before him with a pair of scales in his hand, such as are used by merchants. 19. For a son will be born to Israel who will destroy all Egypt and its inhabitants, and will bring the Israelites out of Egypt with a mighty hand.

Book of Jasher, Chapter 68:1. At that time the Spirit of God came upon Miriam, daughter of Amram, Aaron's sister, and she went out and prophesied over her father's house, saying, "Behold, a son will be born to us this time from my father and mother, and he will save Israel from the hand of Egypt." 2. When Amram heard his daughter's words, he went and brought his wife home, after he had driven her out, at the time when Pharaoh commanded to cast every male child of the house of Jacob into the water. 3. So Amram took Jochebed his wife three years after he had driven her out, and he went to her, and she conceived. 4. At the end of seven months after her conception, she bore a son; and the whole house was filled with a great light, as the light of the sun and moon when they shine. 5. When the woman saw that the child was good and pleasant to the eye, she hid him in a room for three months.

Book of Jasher, Chapter 68:21. Now his sister Miriam was among the Egyptian women by the riverbank. When she saw this, she said to Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get a nurse from the Hebrew women, that she may nurse the child for you?" 22. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Go." The young woman (who was no more than four years old) went and called the child's mother. 23. Pharaoh's daughter said to Jochebed, "Take this child away and nurse him for me, and I will pay you two pieces of silver a day." So the woman took the child and nursed him. 24. At the end of two years, when the child had grown, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her adopted son. She named him Moses, because she said, "Because I took him out of the water."

Jochebed was born in Egypt. This is the beginning of the 210 years of Egyptian oppression. Jochebed was 126 when Miriam was born. Moses was 80 at the time of the Exodus, 210 years – 80 = 130. Jochebed was 130 years old when Moses was born. Therefore, Miriam was 4 years old when Moses was born.

Book of Jasher, ch. 59:9. The sons of Levi were Gershon, Kohath, and Merari, and their sister Jochebed, who was born to them when they went to Egypt.

Book of Jasher, chapter 67:2. This man went and took a wife, Jochebed, the daughter of Levi and his father's sister, and she was 126 years old; and he went in to her.

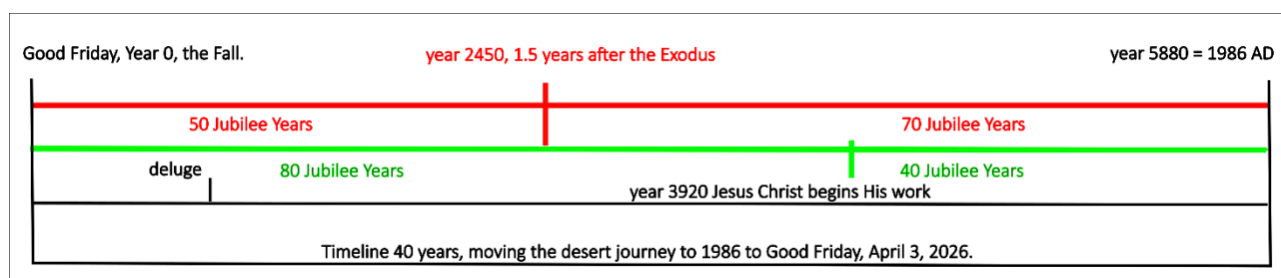
Book of Jasher, chapter 81:3. The sojourn of the children of Israel, who dwelt in the land of Egypt with hard labor, was 210 years (their sojourning from the time of the covenant sacrifice lasted 430 years). 4. At the end of 210 years the Lord brought the children of Israel out of Egypt with a mighty hand (400 years after the birth of Isaac, Abraham's descendants).

Exodus 7:7 Moses was eighty years old and Aaron eighty-three years old when they spoke to Pharaoh.

Just a quick thought.

Note: The Bible texts are translated from Dutch Bibles.

1986: Logically, there's a slight difference, because the Fall of Man didn't occur on January 1, 3895 BC (the year 0). As you can see, I assume the Fall of Man occurred on Good Friday in the year 0. My starting point is God's incredible precision, based on the day of Jesus' death and the Passover lamb that began the Exodus. The monk Dionysius Exiguus' assumption about Jesus' birthday is also incorrect.



Daniel 9:2 In the first year of his reign, it became clear to me, Daniel, from the books that the number of years the word of the LORD to Jeremiah the prophet had spoken concerning the fulfillment of the time for the ruins of Jerusalem was seventy years.

Jeremiah 25:10-14 Israel and its neighbors will be subject to the king of Babylon (synonym for Satan) for seventy years. Afterward, when the seventy years of slavery are completed, I will punish the king of Babylon and his people for their sins.

Genesis 6:3 EBV24 Then the LORD said, "My Spirit will not abide in man forever; **because of his sins he is flesh; his days will be one hundred and twenty years.**"

120 jubilees of 49 years = 5,880 years. Added the 40-year desert journey, it is also 5,920 years. Many preachers want you to believe that a Jubilee period lasts 50 years, but they overlook this scripture: **Leviticus 25:21-22:** "In the sixth year I will command my blessing on you, and the land will produce fruit for three years. In the eighth year you will sow again. You will continue to eat the old fruit until the ninth year. Until the new fruit comes in, you will continue to eat the old fruit."
